To produce peppers there is a lot of picking and deseeding by hand – so today we have created more than 1600 agricultural jobs in the area of Polokwane. Mufama is a major employer with a staff complement of 400 direct jobs at the production facility in Polokwane.

As well as the employment, we have created, we are also partner with around approximately 18 farmers each with an average of 2 -15 hectares. We are supporting them through capital training which included detailed manuals on all aspects of commercial farming. Mufama also visit the farmers regularly to offer technical help and check the fields.

Through this, we have created valuable and mutually beneficial partnership with DTI and IDC.

We are also involved in various Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (BBBEE) farming initiatives as part of our Corporate Social Investment (CSI) programme.
